HOW MUCH? \$50 to paint your parking space (does not include permit, paint or supplies)

THE PROCESS:

- **Step 1**: Purchase a student parking permit first, and then purchase a Painted Parking Space. (Please note, student parking is limited and permits are available on a first-come, first-served basis.)
- **Step 2**: Submit a copy of your design and a signed painting contract to Ms. Bradshaw in the front office (pages 2 and 3 of this document) in person or by email, by the deadline outlined in the payment portal.
- Step 3: Once your design has been reviewed, you will receive an email (at the email address you provide on the Design Request Form) letting you know if it is approved, unacceptable, or if any changes need to be made.
- Step 4: You will attend 1 or 2 of two designated painting days to complete your painting. Painting days are listed in the online payment portal. You may ONLY paint during the designated painting days/hours under school supervision.

Paint requirements:

- Paint must be water-based exterior latex.
- No spray paint, reflective or fluorescent paint permitted.
- You will provide your own paint. (Consider sharing with others.)

Prohibited:

- No offensive language, pictures, or symbols.
- No negative or rude language (Be nice).
- No "gang-style tagging."
- No double entendres (Double meanings).
- No flags
- No political statements, messages, or symbols
- Must be school-appropriate and follow all Trivium handbook guidelines to be consistent with Great Hearts parameters. We reserve the right to deny any painting request we feel does not reflect Great Hearts virtues or doesn't fit the spirit of our school.
- You may include your name but no one else's name. If you want to use a nickname it must be approved. (A boyfriend's or girlfriend's name is NOT allowed.)

If you paint any prohibited items in your space, you will paint over the parking space, you may face disciplinary action, and you may forfeit your parking permit with no refund.

If I do not abide by any of these rules:


- I will forfeit my painting privilege

Senior Parking Design Request

The design must fit within the parking space dimensions, 4 inches from white lines on each side. Do not paint over the number in your parking spot.

Draw your design below in color to represent exactly what you will be painting.



Explain here what this design represents or means:

ON THE PAINTING DAYS:

Show up on time! It will be hot and you want to be painting early.

What you need:

- your paint
- your copy of your approved design so you will have your approved template to follow. You must follow this design exactly – no changes allowed.
- a broom to sweep off your spot before painting. (A battery-powered leaf blower works even better)
- paintbrushes, rollers, paint trays (rollers for "rough surface" work best)
- a blanket or cardboard to kneel/sit on while painting. The pavement is hot!
- Shade structure will be helpful
- Lots of water and Gatorade/sports drink

School will provide:

- Tarp to put under paint supplies
- Garbage bags for cleanup
- Tape to mark off space
- **Step 1**: Check in with the school supervisor and get your paint approved.
- Step 2: Clean off your space and tape the edges to mark 4 inches from white lines
- **Step 3**: Paint your spot
- **Step 4**: Clean up. Place all garbage in garbage bags, <u>tie them shut</u>, and drop them in the dumpsters as you exit campus. Leftover paint or supplies you want to re-use will be placed in garbage bags and taken home to be cleaned. There is no hose or washing station available at the school for cleanup.
