The pieces assumed their current powers in Spain in the late 15th century; the modern rules were standardized in the 19th century. People have been enjoying chess for over a millennium!

Do you want to learn more about our legal system? Do you want to improve your public speaking skills? Do you love to argue your point? Do you enjoy drama?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, then mock trial may be the club for you! Mock trial is an amazing program, teaching and enhancing analytical thinking and public speaking skills, as well as poise and self-confidence. Each year, the Arizona Foundation for Legal Services and Education puts out a new mock trial case that is either criminal or civil in nature. Each team is comprised of 6-8 students who present either the prosecution/plaintiff or defense side of the case through playing the roles of attorneys and witnesses in a simulated trial. Each team prepares both sides of the case, including opening statements, direct examinations, cross-examinations, and closing arguments. During a given round of competition, a team will present one side of the case against a team from a different school that would be presenting the other side. Arizona holds a regional competition in early March from which teams have the opportunity to advance to the state competition in late March. The winner of the state competition advances to the national competition in May. Beginning in January, students will be required to attend extended and/or additional practice times in preparation for regional, state, and national competitions.

Practices will be held on Tuesdays after school from 3:00-4:30 p.m. (starting September 17); and Thursdays from 6:30 -8:30 p.m. (starting October 24). Beginning in January, students will be required to attend weekend practices in preparation for regional, state, and national competitions. Official auditions for the team will be held at the Thursday, October 24 meeting. A link for payment (\$160 for the year) will be sent to individuals that are placed on a team after the audition process.
