### **Enrichment Course Descriptions**

Ag Leadership Course (Grades 7-8) - Mondays, 3:00-4:00 pm

COST: \$60/semester INSTRUCTOR: Mrs. Zimmerman \*Max Enrollment of 30 students

The middle school Ag Leadership course serves as a means for students in middle school to explore the opportunities available to them in the High School Agriscience Program. Course meetings will be led by student FFA leaders. Course members will spend time in hands-on applications (caring for school gardens), studying FFA history and purpose, applying professional skills, as well as studying plant and animal science. Students who are in 8th grade will be prepared to enroll in Agriscience courses in High School and participate as a member of the Trivium FFA.

Class Dates: Mondays, Sept 6-November 26, 2021, excluding half days and holidays

#### Chess (Grades 6-12) - Fridays, 3:00-4:00 pm

**COST:** \$60/semester INSTRUCTOR: Mr. Ryan and Mr. Manion \*Max Enrollment of 30 students

Chess provides scholars with the opportunity to build an advanced knowledge of the strategy, tactics, and skills crucial to the mastery of the game. Students will become familiar with a wealth of new skills that will expand their knowledge as well as deepen their appreciation for this magnificent game of strategy.

#### Creative Writing (Grades 6-12) - Mondays, 3:15-4:15 pm

COST: \$80/semester INSTRUCTORS: Mr. Sylvester and Mr. Heisler \*No Max Enrollment

Creative Writing offers a collaborative space for students to write, read, and provide feedback to each other's work. The Creative Writing Course supports all kinds of writing projects and interests including non-fiction, fiction, and poetry by expanding your imagination and turning writers into a good storyteller. Writers will create a journal of their work and perform in front of their peers at the end of the course.

#### Envirothon (Grades 9-12) - Thursday and Friday, 3:00-4:00 pm

COST: \$100/year-long commitment INSTRUCTOR: Ms. Foote

Envirothon is a course which will plunge into the world of science and demonstrate knowledge of environmental science and natural resource management practices. Teams will be formed and will attend an overnight competition at the end April where their knowledge and problem-solving skills will be tested. This is a unique opportunity for scholars to display their unique knowledge and passion for science and the world around them.

#### Film (Grades 9-12) - Mondays, 3:00-4:15 pm

**COST: \$30/semester INSTRUCTOR:** Mr. Fitch \*Max Enrollment of 30 students

Have you ever wanted to write your own screenplay? Or take your acting skills to the screen? This is an exciting way to get yourself out there! We watch movies, eat snacks, and even create some of our own films that we plan to submit to competitions. It is the perfect opportunity to use your imagination to the fullest and create new friends along the way.

Class Dates: Mondays, Sept 6-November 26, 2021, excluding half days and holidays

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<u>"Friday Knight Dice" High School Strategic Games (Grades 9-12)</u> – Fridays, 3:00-4:30 pm

COST: \$ 70/semester INSTRUCTOR: Mr. Solis and Mr. DePauw \*No Max Enrollment

Students will focus on learning strategy through tabletop games and dramatic performance through roleplaying. This course will utilize tabletop roleplaying games as a vehicle for collaborative and improvisational storytelling. Students will be writing/creating characters and scenes, planning sessions, and interacting with each other's plots and characters within an ever changing narrative. Meeting times may extend longer as the year progresses and will be communicated from the instructors.

Future Health Professionals (Grades 9-12) - Mondays, 3:15-4:15 pm

COST: \$60/semester INSTRUCTOR: Nurse Schooley \*Max Enrollment of 40 students

Students will have the opportunity to shadow/volunteer alongside medical professionals, listen to guest speakers, and engage in hands-on scenarios. This course will enhance college applications by providing students with an understanding of what it means to pursue a career in the medical field.

<u>Italian (Grades 9-12)</u> – Mondays and Fridays, 3:00-4:30 pm

COST: \$80/semester INSTRUCTOR: Ms. Webb \*No Max Enrollment

Italiano! The Italian course will give students an introduction to basic Italian. Students will learn how to speak Italian, how to recognize the regions of Italy, and will build up their knowledge to try to help them read the italian classics like the *Inferno* and *The Prince*. Students will also be using Italian to learn about things like Italian food, Italian history, and Italian art and culture.

Students will complete the course by performing skits for parents and friends. Tickets for Skit Night will be about \$5/person to cover supplies, and it will take place in late November or early December.

Junior Classical League (Grades 6-12) - Thursdays, 3:15-4:15 PM

The National Junior Classical League (NJCL) is a local, state, and national organization. Chapter members get to shape the course and express their love of ancient Greece and Rome together. Students have the opportunity to compete in academic testing, certamen (Latin quiz bowl), graphic arts competitions, creative arts competitions, and athletic contests. Students can also participate in community service projects, workshops, and social activities to meet other students of the classics from Arizona as well as

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Nevada. JCL will also organize fun activities just for our chapter or school; possible activities include making mosaics, cooking Roman food, and celebrating Roman holidays.

Note: Registration fee includes t-shirt and organization dues. Additional fees will be collected for any students who choose to attend competitions/conferences. Major events are the ASU Fall Forum on November 17 and the State Convention which is currently scheduled for March 2.

Scholars will also have the opportunity to refine their leadership skills while working with younger scholars.

Mock trial is an amazing program, teaching and enhancing analytical thinking and public speaking skills, as well as poise and self-confidence. Each year, the Arizona Foundation for Legal Services and Education puts out a new mock trial case that is either criminal or civil in nature. Each team is comprised of 6-8 students who present either the prosecution/plaintiff or defense side of the case through playing the roles of attorneys and witnesses in a simulated trial. Each team prepares both sides of the case, including opening statements, direct examinations, cross-examinations, and closing arguments. During a given round of competition, a team will present one side of the case against a team from a different school that would be presenting the other side. Arizona holds a regional competition in early March from which teams have the opportunity to advance to the state competition in late March. The winner of the state competition advances to the national competition in May. Beginning in January, students will be required to attend extended and/or additional practice times in preparation for regional, state, and national competitions.

Starting on September 21st we will meet on Tuesdays for everyone interested in participating. We will hold formal auditions for the team on the evening of Thursday, November 4th. Individuals selected for the team can then submit payment for participation.
