Enrichment Course Descriptions

Birding and Wildlife Course (Grades 9-12)

weekends, TBD, 1-2 times per month INSTRUCTOR: Ms. Foote COST: free for this year Year-long course No Max Enrollment

Birding and Wildlife Enrichment Course gives students the opportunity to align their love of wildlife and the outdoors with the foundation of scientific observation. Students participating in this course will practice identifying wildlife in the classroom and in the field. The group will meet off campus for birding and wildlife identification 1-2 times per month. An initial meeting is scheduled for Monday, August 22 in room 314 at 3:30pm when the group will schedule the birdwatching days.

Class Dates: TBD weekends, Aug 29, 2022 – May 19, 2023. *This is a year–long course and does not re-open for enrollment in the spring.*

CHOIR (Grades 9-12)

Tuesdays and Fridays, 3:30-4:30 PM in room 312 INSTRUCTORS: Ms. Joseph and Mr. Dell COST: free for this year Year-long course Minimum Enrollment of 6 / No Max Enrollment

Honors Choir will focus on vocal techniques, independent singing, and advanced choral ensemble skills. Participants will learn challenging and beautiful repertoire, which they will perform in the end-of-semester high school concert. Honors Choir strengthens cross-grade friendships and gets students in touch with their own bodies as a musical instrument. Singing is beneficial not just physically and mentally, but for the larger social support it engenders. We plan to participate in the NAU Jazz Madrigal Festival in February 2023 which will further expand genre experience in performance.

There will be an additional fee of \$35-\$50 for participants who participate in NAU Jazz Madrigal Festival, Regionals and/or Fall Choir Festival. This fee will be collected from participants when we get closer to the festival dates.

Class Dates: Tuesdays and Fridays, Aug 29, 2022 – May 19, 2023, excluding holidays and half days. *This is a year–long course and does not re-open for enrollment in the spring.*

Creative Writing (Grades 6-12)

Mondays, 3:30-4:30pm in the library COST: free for this year INSTRUCTORS: Mr. Selstad and Mr. Heisler Year-long course

The Creative Writing Society is a workshop course where members can hone their creative writing skills, learn new writing methods, practice writing alongside other writers, get peer feedback on their work, and help produce a literary journal.

Class Dates: Mondays, Aug 29, 2022 – May 19, 2023, excluding holidays and half days. *This is a year–long course and does not re-open for enrollment in the spring.*

Crochet (Grades 6-12)

Thursdays, 3:30-4:30pm in room 311 INSTRUCTOR: Ms. Crane COST: free for this year

Max Enrollment of 15

Students will explore the history and techniques used in modern crochet. They will learn the techniques of chain stitch, single, double and triple crochet as well as finishing off a project, weaving in ends, and blocking. A project will be chosen by students from a list of choices at the beginning of the course and will be completed by the end of the course. There will be a number of projects that students can complete, such as kitchen towels, bags, containers, shawls, sweaters or cup cozies.

After registration, students must pay a supply fee of \$25 which is linked in the payment portal online.

Envirothon (Grades 9-12)

Thursday and Friday, 3:30-4:30pm in room 314 COST: free for this year INSTRUCTOR: Ms. Foote Minimum enrollment of 5 / Max Enrollment of 15 Year-long course

Envirothon focuses on understanding ecosystems and interactions between water, soil, wildlife and forestry with applied problem solving to current issues. This course supplements science education as well as developing leadership and team skills. Envirothon participates in a competition against other schools in the spring. If the team advances to national and international level, additional travel expenses may be incurred.

Class Dates: Thursdays and Fridays, Aug 29, 2022 – May 19, 2023, excluding holidays and half days *Envirothon is a year–long course and does not re-open for enrollment in the spring.*

Film Course (Grades 9-12)

Mondays, 3:30-4:30pm in room 410 COST: free for this year INSTRUCTOR: Mr. Keithley Max Enrollment of 30 students

Film allows you to use your imagination to the fullest and create new friends along the way. Students will learn the art of storytelling through the medium of film. This will be done by creating storyboards, filming, acting and editing. Students will be able to tell stories upholding the virtues of truth and goodness through the beauty of making their own films.

Friday Knight Dice (Grades 9-12)

DePauw Group: Fridays, 3:30-5:00pm in Room 416 Solis Group: Monday and Tuesday 3:15-4:15 in Room 436 COST: free for this year INSTRUCTORS: Mr. DePauw and Mr. Solis Minimum enrollment of 5 / Max Enrollment of 15 students Year-long course

The Friday Knight Dice enrichment course is focused on engaging the members in creative collaboration as they journey through a fantasy world on an epic quest. Members will learn how to create unique characters that can interact with the dramatic storytelling of an unfolding quest, the stories of other characters, and a rich world filled with diverse roleplaying encounters. The goal is for the students to complete the quest stated in the opening of the campaign, accomplishing each of the tasks required for this quest through collaboration with their peers and engaging with the storytelling narrative, all while developing social, improvisational, and problem-solving skills. Scholars will be assigned a campaign following our initial course meeting and may not be guaranteed their first preference of campaign or day(s) of play due to a player limit of 6 per campaign.

Class Dates: Mondays/Tuesdays OR Fridays, Aug 29, 2022 – May 19, 2023, excluding holidays and half days. *This is a year–long course and does not re-open for enrollment in the spring.*

Future Health Professionals (Grades 9-12)

Mondays, 3:30-4:30pm in room 314 INSTRUCTOR: Dr. Foote COST: \$120 Max Enrollment of 30 Year-long course

Students will have the opportunity to listen to guest speakers, learn more about work in the medical field, and engage in hands-on scenarios. This course will enhance college applications and provide students with an understanding of what it means to pursue a career in the medical community.

Class Dates: Mondays Aug 29, 2022 – May 19, 2023, excluding holidays and half days. *This is a year–long course and does not re-open for enrollment in the spring.*

Junior Classical League (Grades 6-12)

Thursdays, 3:30-4:30pm in room 407 COST: free for this year only INSTRUCTOR: Magistra Oakes No Max Enrollment Year-long course The National Junior Classical League encourages an interest in ancient Greece and Rome among secondary students through academic events and conventions. Trivium chapter members have the opportunity to participate in events at the National, State, and Chapter level. Possible events/competitions include academic testing, Certamen (classics knowledge quiz bowl), graphic arts, creative arts, athletics, service projects, workshops, social activities with other Arizona chapters, drama performances, a debate tournament, Olympics, and cooking Roman food. Members will participate in Digital (multiple choice) Competitions arranged through the National Organization on Vocabulary, Civilization, Etymology (Fees are part of course), usually completed during meetings. Monthly State Organization events, sometimes in-person off campus, sometimes over Zoom from students' homes.

Note: Additional fees will be collected for any students who choose to attend competitions/conferences and purchase t-shirts. Important dates include Fall Forum at ASU on November 18 and the State Convention which is usually the last week of March. If you qualify to advance at state, there is also the National Convention at the end of the summer.

Knights of Game-a-Lot (Middle School, grades 6-8)

Tuesdays 3:30-4:30pm in room 406 COST: free for this year INSTRUCTOR: Mr. Paul Johnson Max Enrollment of 16 students Year-long course

In the "Knights of Game-a-lot" we explore the variety of newer strategy games to gain an appreciation for their mechanics and systems. Mock Trial (HS, Grades 9-12)

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45, Thursdays 6:30-8:30pm, weekends starting in 3rd quarter Room 435 COST: \$180 INSTRUCTORS: Ms. Brinker, Mr. Grable Minimum enrollment of 8 / Max Enrollment of 24 Year-long course **Audition required**

Do you want to learn more about our legal system? Do you want to improve your public speaking skills? Do you love to argue your point? Do you enjoy drama? If you answered yes to any of these questions, then mock trial may be the program for you!

In mock trial, scholars will focus on learning about the legal system, specifically trial practice. The course will allow scholars to develop and enhance analytical thinking and public speaking skills, as well as poise and self-confidence. They will work in teams of 6-8 scholars to learn how to effectively analyze a criminal case by preparing for both the prosecution and defense sides of the case. They will learn how to write and deliver direct examinations, cross examinations, opening statements, and closing arguments. Scholars will also learn to argue the Federal Rules of Evidence and have the opportunity to play the roles of witnesses. Teams will compete against other schools in a regional competition in early March from which teams have the opportunity to advance to the state competition in late March. The winner of the state competition advances to the national competition in May.

After auditions in mid-October, if students are not placed on a Mock Trial team, they may request to have their fee refunded.

Class Dates: Tuesdays, Thursdays, weekends **September 20**, 2022 – May 19, 2023, excluding holidays and half days. *This is a year–long course and does not re-open for enrollment in the spring*.

Musical Theater Cast (Gr 6-12)

Mon/Tues/Thurs/Fri 3:30-5:30pm in room 312 and the stage COST: \$150 INSTRUCTORS: Ms. MacLeod, Mr & Mrs Dell, Ms. Joseph No Max Enrollment Audition required to be placed in a role. Audition packets can be found in room 312 or on the

Stage. This packet will be due on the first day of auditions (August 29th).

The intention of the Middle School Musical enrichment course is to introduce students to the world of musical theater both on and off stage. They will interact with a published musical by learning to create and portray a believable character onstage. It is the hope that this enrichment course will foster a love of theater arts, specifically musical theater. Students will demonstrate their understanding of the skills acquired through a performance that will be open to the public.

For the fall Musical Theater program, middle school students will be cast in lead roles, and high school in supporting roles as they build a community that supports each other and fosters community and learning from one semester to the next.

This fall's production will be *Seussical JR*. Performances will be November 17-19. Auditions for musical theater cast are scheduled for August 29-31. Once students are cast, they can accept or decline their role. If they choose to decline, their registration can be refunded until September 6. After September 6, there are no refunds.

Class Dates: Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays: August 29 – Nov. 19, 2022, excluding half days and holidays, with **rehearsals increasing in the 2 weeks prior to performance.**

Musical Theater Crew (Grades 6-12)

Mon/Tues/Thurs/Fri 3:30-5:30pm in room 312 and on the stage **beginning September 6** INSTRUCTORS: Ms. MacLeod, Mr & Mrs Dell, Ms. Joseph COST: \$150 Max enrollment: 20 (first-come, first-served through online registration) After registration, students must complete an application packet and turn in the packet to the musical theater instructors on the first day of rehearsal, September 6. Packets can be found in room 312 or on the Stage.

The intention of the Middle School Musical enrichment course is to introduce students to the world of musical theater both on and off stage. It is the hope that this enrichment course will foster a love of theater arts, specifically musical theater. Students will demonstrate their understanding of the skills acquired through a performance that will be open to the public.

This fall's production will be *Seussical JR*. Performances will be November 17-19.

Robotics (High School, Grades 9-12)

Tuesday and Thursday, 3:30-5:30pm in room 421 COST: \$160 INSTRUCTORS: Mr. Arriaga, Mr. Selstad Max Enrollment of 30 Year-long course **Application required**. Registration is through application only. In High school robotics, scholars will learn how to work on a team to design, build, program, and present a robot that is able to compete in the FIRST Tech Challenge. They will learn simple coding and design, while mastering communication and teamwork. It will provide a place for them to use their STEM skills while also demonstrating their abilities in speech. Teams will compete in tournaments, which may require additional travel and cost.

Class Dates: Tuesdays and Thursdays, Aug 29, 2022 – May 19, 2023, excluding holidays and half days *Robotics is a year–long course and does not re-open for enrollment in the spring.*

Robotics (Middle School, Grades 6-8)

Monday, 3:30-5:00pm in room 421 COST: \$160 INSTRUCTORS: Mr. Arriaga, Mr. Fausett Year-long course Max Enrollment of 20 **Application required.** Registration is through application only. You will be notified by <u>August 15</u> whether you were accepted to the Robotics program. If you are accepted, you will receive a link to submit payment and complete registration.

In Middle School Robotics, Scholars will compete in the FIRST LEGO League where they will have to build and program a robot to complete various small task. In addition, they will need to work as a team to solve a problem they see in the topic that FIRST gave them. For example, last year they had to find and solve a problem in logistics transportation. They will be able to develop a little bit of their STEM skills, practice problem solving, and develop their presentation skills. Teams will compete in a December tournament, which may lead to additional competitions incurring additional travel and cost.

Class Dates Grades 9-12: Mondays, Aug 29 – Dec 9, 2022, excluding holidays and half days, with possibility of continuing into January with competitions.

Sewing (Grades 6-12)

Mondays 3:30-4:30pm in room 401 COST: free for this year INSTRUCTOR: Ms. Boyett Year-long course Max Enrollment: 10

This course will focus on learning to sew or improving sewing skills. We will work to create a series of sewing projects, increasing in difficulty as the semester progresses. Projects include a lanyard, hot pad, pillow, etc.. We will also be working with Musical Theater learning how to measure for clothing/ Costumes, basic costuming skills and

clothing alteration. During the course, we will encourage learning new skills, sharing knowledge, and engaging in positive interaction while working together toward a common goal.

After registration, students must pay a supply fee of \$25 which is linked in the payment portal online.

Class Dates: Mondays, Aug 29, 2022 – May 19, 2023, excluding holidays and half days This is a year–long course and will not open for re-enrollment in spring, unless there are open spots to fill.

Trivium Service Organization (High School, Grades 9-12)

Meetings first Monday of each month during Lyceum, Room 415 COST: \$ 20 INSTRUCTOR: Mr. Manion Year-long course

The Trivium Service Organization exists to provide students with volunteer opportunities to serve the community or our school. In the past, our students have played games at senior homes, packaged food at St. Mary's Food Bank, helped pass out candy at Halloween venues, helped decorate and clean up for our school dances, passed out water to local marathon runners, and taken part in a variety of other volunteer events. The members are not obligated to come to any of the service events; however, if they desire to put Trivium Service Organization on their resume, they must participate in one activity per quarter. The Trivium Service Organization will be participating in service both on and off campus.
