Musical Theater Cast (Gr 6-12)

(High school students will be cast in major roles; middle school students will be cast in supporting roles for spring semester high school musical theater)

Days: Mon/Tues/Thurs/Fri 3:30-5:30pm in room 312 and the stage

COST: \$200

INSTRUCTOR: Mrs. MacLeod

Minimum enrollment: 20

Maximum Enrollment: 40

Audition required to be placed in a role.

Deadline to pay/register after audition: February 25

This course is designed to familiarize students with as many onstage aspects of musical theater as possible. Students will learn how to create a believable character, follow stage directions, and sing & dance with an ensemble. They will spend their time rehearsing every onstage aspect of a musical. This includes but is not limited to memorization, entrances and exits, as well as choreography and vocal work. This course will culminate in a three-performance run in the month of April. Included in registration fees: show Tshirt

This spring's performances will be April 24-26. We will be performing *The Music Man*.

Auditions for musical theater cast are scheduled for January 27-31. Report to stage first. Auditions will run 3:30-5:30pm. Students may finish earlier and will be responsible to call parents and arrange pick-up time.

Once students are cast, they can accept or decline their role. If they choose to decline, their registration can be refunded until Feb. 25. After February 25, there are no refunds.

Class Dates: Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays Feb. 3 - April 26 excluding half days and holidays, with **rehearsals increasing in the 2 weeks prior to performance, including 2 Saturday rehearsals.**

Musical Theater Crew - SOUNDS, LIGHT, STAGE MANAGEMENT (Grades 6-12)

The intention of Sound, Lights and Stage Management enrichment is to give students dedicated time to learn how to design the visual and audio aspects of a theater production; learn how to properly set-up and strike the lights and sound board; and properly put said equipment away. In Stage Management, individuals will learn to support the director by annotating blocking and direct on-stage action of the running crew. Students will learn valuable skills in time management, organization, and hone their leadership skills. Students will demonstrate their understanding of the skills acquired through a performance that will be open to the public. Included in registration fees: show Tshirt

Members of the sounds/light crew will ONLY attend on FRIDAYS.

Musical Theater Crew - SCENIC DESIGN, PUBLICITY, AND PROPS (Grades 6-12)

The intention of Scenic Design, Publicity, and Front of House enrichment is to give students a dedicated place to visually create the world of the production through scenic design; design creative ways to publicize the current production; and be instructed on how to interact with the audience as ushers for performances nights. Students will be allowed avenues to express the visual art skills that they have learned in their classes taken at Trivium. Students will demonstrate their understanding of the skills acquired through a performance that will be open to the public. Included in registration fees: show Tshirt

Members of the design crew will ONLY attend on MONDAYS.

The intention of Props, Costumes, and Hair/Make-Up Enrichment is to allow students dedicated time to learn how to construct or find necessary materials for the assorted properties in the show; learn about the style and types of costumes that will be needed for the performances; master/attempt techniques to accomplish the Hair/Make-Up designs for the characters in the show; as well as design the overall look of these elements so that there is a common thread between these elements of theater. Using creativity and research, students will heighten their problem solving and organizational skills. Students will demonstrate their understanding of the skills acquired through a performance that will be open to the public. Included in registration fees: show Tshirt

Members of the props/costumes crew will ONLY attend on MONDAYS.

The intention of the Set Construction will be to give students an opportunity to learn different skills concerning construction (including but not limited to using power tools); they will build the set for the current production; and when the performance days arrive they will be responsible for executing the movement of said set on-stage. This enrichment will allow students to not only problem solve, but apply assorted mathematical skills that they have learned throughout their academic careers to theater. Students will demonstrate their understanding of the skills acquired through a performance that will be open to the public. Included in registration fees: show Tshirt

- Max enrollment: 60

This mini-workshop will be a support to help students understand and prepare for the process of auditioning for the musical.

This workshop will teach students what to expect when they enter an audition. This may include (but is not limited to) finding vocal range, learning the songs for the audition, and poise and presentation of self in the audition room. This is NOT required to audition for the musical but it will be helpful.

Thespian Troupe (Grades 9-12)

- COST: \$70 for new members / \$35 for returning members (all members are new this year)
- Max enrollment: 30
- **BY APPLICATION ONLY** – Pick up an application from Mrs. MacLeod on the stage. If you are approved, she will send you a link to register.

A thespian troupe is an honor society for high school theater students and technicians, and its purpose is to recognize and reward excellence in the theater arts as well as promote the art of theater, support fellow troupes, and attend annual festivals.

The troupe would serve students in grades 9–12 who will be members of the International Thespian Society. The ITS is a division of the Educational Theatre Association (EdTA). It was founded in 1929 and has inducted more than 2.4 million theater students. Benefits of membership include:

- membership pin, card, and certificate
- Exclusive interviews for college admission and scholarships
- School, state, and international leadership opportunities
- A subscription to Dramatics magazine

Activities for members include:

- Meetings
- Induction ceremonies
- Community service projects
- Attending state thespian events
- Attending annual festivals

Possible competitions include: Regional Festival at West Mec in January and International Festival in Indianapolis in June. **Additional costs may apply if students participate in competitions.**
